Dear Kinsolving:

Well, it has been about 18 months since my long awaited search ended. It has been a year filled with emotionally highs and lows. But I would not trade the knowledge for anything, and am forever grateful for your 15 year search and support in finding my original identity.

I met my birthmom a year ago. It is still up and down, though the relationship is improving. She had spent 45 years trying to block out my existence and had never told her husband or their children. He now knows, though she still has not told her other 2 daughters. I have met her 4 times this past year, once for an hour, then a few months later for lunch and then another lunch and then for a round of golf and dinner. She has called me on Easter and my birthday, which was a major step for her. Though, it will be a long time, if ever, before she and I will be close I am glad that I now know who she is. Apparently, she is not close with her other daughters, either. Her husband is fantastic

and he has been accepting of me and has informed me that his marriage has never been better because now he knows why she is the way that she is.

In September they told me the identity of my birthfather. Though he is deceased, his family has welcomed me with open arms. His brother called me and told me that they consider me 100% a member of the family. I have met my brother and 2 sisters, in addition to an aunt and uncle and a step grandmother. I met one of my birthdad's daughters in December. It is amazing how alike we are, considering the different environment that we grew up in (me in downtown Chicago and Lisa in rural Georgia) When they have introduced me to people I am introduced as her sister. I was down in Georgia in march, and we went to the area that my birthdad grew up in etc. My 12 year old niece emails me a few times a week and I have been invited to their house in Georgia for Thanksgiving.

I have met my cousin (birthdad's brother's son) and seen his band in concert and have talked to Uncle Jim on a regular basis and hope to get to meet him soon.

I feel as though my questions have been answered and it has been a positive part of my life and even when I am down at the coldness of my birthmother I have never had any regrets on the search.

And I want to thank you for your tenacity and your counseling.

Dear Kinsolving,

I cannot begin to thank you enough!!!!!! Words can't express the emotions that were there between my brother and I. It took me awhile, but after running to the store to get cigarettes, calling Mom, I knew the moment was there yesterday!!!!!! You just know in your heart when the timing is right!!!! Couldn't stand to wait for a reply from the list, so I rummaged through some NYS returned to sender letters, I'd written last year to those in one of my databases, my pile of search materials all over the floor in my room:) It was very similar to what you suggested to say!!!! Then what you said came back into my head. I was READY!!!!!!

So, I dialed the number, wrote down the one word subjects, "just in case" we were at a loss. NOT NECESSARY!!!!!!!!!!!! I said "Hi, is this D?" Wow, hearing his voice for the first time!!! AWESOME!!!!!!!!!! Then I said, "Well, is this a good time to talk? Are you alone?" Oh, and by the way I'm not a saleslady!" He said "Yes, I guess so". I replied, "You were born on _____, in Buffalo, NY?" He said "Yes". I could tell by his reaction then, that it was okay, the tone in his voice, very easy going....I said "My name is S, I'm your

sister!!!!" He said, all excited, very receptive, "I was born _____". Then he said, "I think my Mother's name was RV..... I said does the name A M mean anything to you, then he said, "Wait a minute!!! My Dad's name was R M". I said "Yes!!!!" He said "Oh,my god this is unbelievable!!!!" We were never once at a loss of words!!!!!! He said he started to search in 1999, after his adoptive father passed away, within a month. He hired 1-800-US-Search,-nothing-:)

Funny, I'd also called them, back in the days when I was a naive searcher:)S said he tried looking for Miller on the Internet!!! Said, he even searched in FLA, thinking they may have retired there.I said, Unfortunately, things started to go in a state of disarray with his wife, and he stopped his efforts!!! She also took his computer!!!! We decided, should this had not occurred, we would have found each other over a year ago!!!!

He ransacked his house, while we were talking. There was never a real moment's silence!!!!!!!!!! He said he had the papers, with both their names on it, along with his "original birth certificate"!!!!!! As is his younger sis:), he is very disorganized!!!! At LAST HE FOUND THE PAPERS!!! EXCEPT FOR HIS BC!!!!!!!!!!!!!! He read off our birthparents names, and the actual RELINQUISHMENT PAPERS THAT HAD MOM'S/Dad's signatures. He said they looked like they were written, with the same handwriting!!!!!! ". How did they get these papers???? Have heard of the adoption decree with bnames on it but RELINQUISHMENT PAPERS. AND Original BC???? Also some of the NON-ID they had was false! Included, that he had a younger sister who was adopted!!! Also, the bfamily was of a Political Background-ALSO FALSE!!!!!! He said the latter deterred him from his search for us, because he'd had fears Politicians were crooks, at one time:). and that he didn't want anything to hurt his aparents who'd ENCOURAGED HIM TO SEARCH!!!! I must say, I respect him, for respecting his Aparents that way!!!!!!!!

Boggles my mind. Anyhow to make a long story short, I'm continuing this letter a day or so, later, as you can probably tell, by the way it's written. I'd called him on Sunday, evening, we spoke well over 4 hours!!! Only hung up because his phone battery went dead!!! Luckily for me I'd given him my number. We're both airheads!!!!!! It took a few minutes for me to relay the number to him. There is without doubt, absolutely he IS MY BROTHER!!!! He of course later called me that evening, around 1am his time!!!!

It was so funny, he said he KNEW HE HAD A SISTER who was gonna FIND HIM!!!! And, "What took you so long Sis, 45 years!!!!!!" We also wished each other belated "Happy Birthdays", his being JULY 4th, I said "By the way Happy Birthday". Mine being JULY !0th ,1955, he said Happy Birthday to you, too!!! At the beginning of April, you found my husband's b-mom for us.

We both teach, and wanted to call her in the AM, so we waited until June to contact her.

All went well, thanks to your excellent coaching session.

I am the one who made the initial call. R's b-mom was very shocked to say the least. I used the phone script you gave us, telling her who I was, and asking if it was a good time to talk. She said it was - and I went over the 4 impt. points you gave us - about not interrupting her life, just wanting to talk, considering it a private matter, and saying we wanted medical info., and anything else she cared to share.

She mostly just listened as I went through those 4 points. Then, all at once she just started talking, telling me all about his b-father, etc.

She later admitted that she had very nearly hung up on me when I mentioned the date he was born. She had never told anyone in 48 years about him. Her mother (now deceased) is the only family member who knew. She had never even told her first husband of nearly 50 years.

I really think that if I had called her up and said, "I think you're my husband's b-mom, she probably would have denied it." So, I just wanted to tell you thank you for all of your help!

The coaching/counseling session is so important. I'm fairly certain this reunion would have never taken place had it not been for your knowledge and experience.

R's b-mom has said she would like to meet him someday, and has told one family member about him.

They have talked on the phone several times.

Dear Kinsolving:

This is our belated "thank you" for tracking down S's birth mother in April. As all the testimonials read, you work very fast. And your assistant was very nice on the telephone. This has been a joint project for S and I so we spent a lot of time talking about what to do with the information. Since his birth mother was single (her husband (a subsequent relationship - not S's father) had abandoned her about 25 years ago) we thought that she might be receptive to hearing from us.

S's biggest concern was rejection by her. Although you suggested calling rather than writing, S simply couldn't pick up the phone to make the call. He's a professional writer so he wrote a wonderful letter telling about himself (married, a baby, Ivy League education, etc). He asked his birthmother to call on a certain day and time. He said that if he didn't hear from her he would understand that she didn't want contact. Well, at the appointed time she called and they had a nice three-hour conversation. Her kids had known about his existence for about the last ten years. They seem like basically nice people who have had tough lives but are doing fairly well now. She talked mostly of herself and said that the details around the time of his birth were fuzzy. She said that if she concentrated, she was sure she'd be able to remember a lot more. She expressed surprise to have heard from him but was very happy. "Your timing is great," she said, "This comes at a good time in my life." She and her kids, she said, were anxious to know more about S. She said that she is always there for her kids and that S is one of her kids so feel free to call any time of the day or night. About a week later I sent her a very nice letter thanking her for being so nice and I said we'd e-mail some photos to her. So about a week ago we send her the e-mail photos (she has e-mail at home). Several

days passed and we got a response. She said that we've really "brightened up" her "boring life" and that the pictures were "wonderful". I sent her an e-mail asking if S or our daughter bore any resemblance to her family. And I also said that we were anxious to see the pictures of her family that she had promised. That was about a week ago. No reply. We're puzzled. She seems nice and happy to have heard from us. But things are moving so slowly. In my letter I said that we really were anxious to get any medical information (diseases and allergies). Our perception is that we are so hungry for some quick, basic info and she is thinking more of a long term relationship thing which typically develops more slowly. Perhaps the issue is also that we've had the months to think about hiring you and had time to make the decision. This has been sprung on her rather suddenly.

Basically, S and I are fairly type-A New Yorkers who, if left up to our own devices, would hop on a plane to her town and spent a few hours hearing her story. We told her that we'd like to do that or fly her up to NY.

We don't yet know how things are going to turn out. Any insight into the mind of a typical birth mother? Is any birth mother typical? To reiterate, all contact has been very positive, it's just that the progress in knowing things is very slow. Any words of wisdom? We'd appreciate it. We don't want to blow it and come on too strong!
